The Chokers started out fast by whipping Everett 20-12. Halfback Sonny Luke and quarterback Archie Morrison led the high-flying offense.

Columbia Basin, the nation's number one junior college football team, overwhelmed a stubborn Grays Harbor team by a score of 30-6.

The Seattle Cavaliers extended their winning streak to 15 games by squeaking by the Chokers, 14-13. Jim Mahar and Sonny Luke ran well for Grays Harbor.

Lower Columbia was the victim of a vicious offensive onslaught as the Chokers coasted to a 21-0 win. Jim Mahar was the offensive leader, while Loren Wall stood out on defense by intercepting a Red Devil pass and running it back for a touchdown.

In a defensive battle, the Chokers emerged as moral victors over favored Wenatchee, even though the score read 0-0. Sam Schlegel, Don Walkowski, and Lachlan Heron all played a vital part in stopping the Wenatchee offense.

An injury-ridden Grays Harbor team eventually yielded a 20-13 loss to Yakima.

Although dominating the final statistics, the Chokers fell to defeat at the hands of Olympic, 25-7. Grays Harbor outgained the Rangers but were only able to score once. Bill LeRoy ran well for the Chokers. Jerry Hatton and Jim Mahar did fine jobs defensively.

In the final game of the year, Grays Harbor was stopped five times within the Oregon Tech. 20 yard line. The Chokers once more outgained their opponent, but had trouble punching the ball over the goal line. The final score was 7-6, Oregon Tech.

Sonny Luke was high scorer for the year with 38 points while Jim Mahar followed closely with 30 points. Mahar was also a defensive standout, as were Sam Schlegel, Jerry Hatton, Loren Wall, and many others.

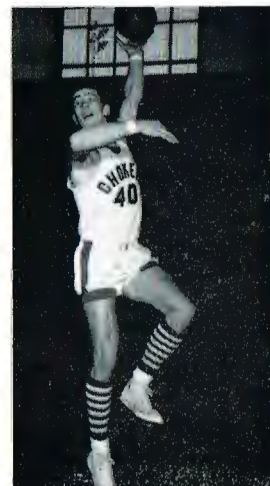

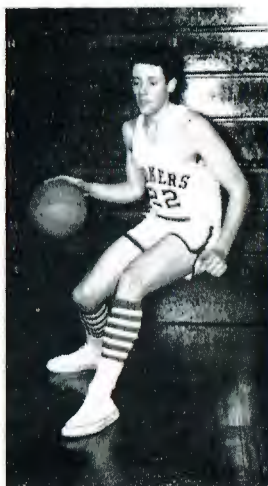

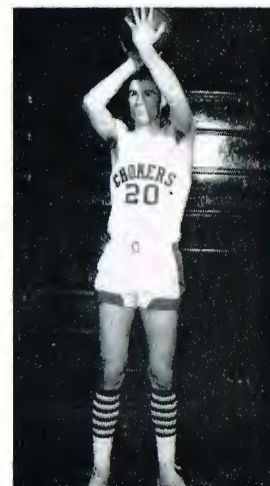
George Raines was a 6'4" forward from Monte. An excellent rebounder, George also was one of the best shots on the team. As a two-year letterman, George will also be missed next year.

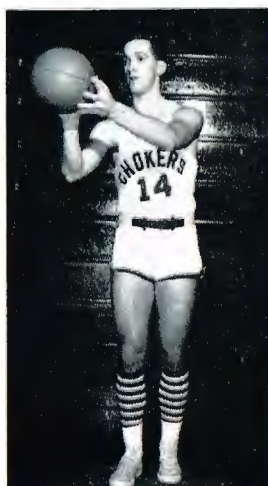

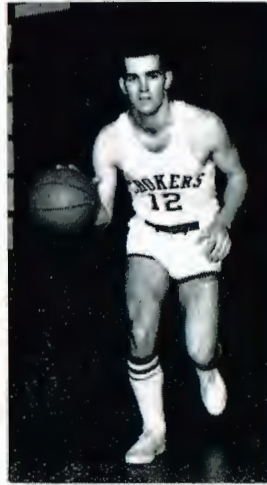
