

Commercial Transportation and Maintenance (CDL) Program Student Testing Procedures for Alcohol and Controlled Substances.

In accordance with federal regulations, all applicants to be enrolled in the Commercial Transportation and Maintenance (CDL) program will be tested for alcohol and controlled substances. Students will also be subject to federally mandated random drug/alcohol screening. If test results are positive at any time, the applicant will **not** be accepted into the program and <u>will not</u> be allowed to re-apply for the Commercial Transportation and Maintenance (CDL) program as indicated in the procedures in this packet.

I understand that if I test positive on any tests for alcohol and/or controlled substances, I will be withdrawn from entry or withdrawn from continuing in the program, unless or until the SAP process as required by law is completed. I understand that a positive test result will be reported to the FMCSA Clearinghouse as required by DOT regulations. A violation will remain on the Clearinghouse for at least 5 years, or until I have completed the SAP's follow-up testing plan, whichever is later. I also understand that tuition and fee refunds will be consistent with the Grays Harbor College Administrative Procedure 501.01.
