#### **Your Instructor**

Your instructor is willing to help! Drop by his or her office during office hours; make an appointment, call, or email. Instructors are there to help students; just ask.

### **Learning Center Tutors**

If the Learning Center is open, there is a tutor who can help with basic math (ABE and math 60) through intermediate algebra (math 98). You don't have to make an appointment to see a tutor, just drop in and ask for help. The Learning Center is located on the first floor of the library building (1519).

#### **Your Classmates**

#### **Interact Math**

#### ModuMath

ModuMath is a collection of digital video lessons that cover math topics from basic math (math 60) through intermediate algebra (math 98).
